**The Literacy Spot 3**

**Synonyms, Antonyms, Homonyms and Homophones**

A **synonym** is a word that means the same or nearly the same as another word. For example, *bucket* and *pail*.

An **antonym** is a word that means the opposite of another. For example, *new* and *old*.

A **homonym** is one of a group of words pronounced in the same way but having different meanings. For example, *bark*, *bat*, *down* and *dear* all have the two meanings but require the same spelling.

A **homophone** is one of a group of words pronounced in the same way but differing in meaning or spelling or both. For example, *bear* and *bare*, *air* and *heir*. These words are pronounced the same but have different spelling and meaning.

Can you come up with some examples of your own for each of these types of words?
